HKCS data can be used to increase public awareness and influence leaders to shape effective public policy by comparing state-level data.





Schools Value HKCS Data

Recently, schools and communities in both rural and urban areas throughout Colorado were asked about their perceptions of the benefits of HKCS data.

- 92% agree or strongly agree that HKCS data has helped provide an understanding of the issues that affect the youth in their community.
- 97% agree or strongly agree that it would be beneficial to have accurate and recent state-level data to compare to local HKCS data.
- 87% agree or strongly agree that HKCS data has been useful in shaping prevention programming being run in their schools.

97% of respondents said they would participate in the statelevel HKCS effort if chosen.
